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### **Job shadowing of the Turkish partner**

The aim of the study visit was for some teachers teaching at our school to get to know the Hungarian partner institution and participate in the project. Our teachers got to know the Hungarian school, the teachers, the students and the project. The participants also visited the workshops and classrooms of the Hungarian institution and found out about the tools and equipment used. During the classroom visits, they received both theoretical and practical information about the Hungarian education system. Our colleagues got to know the school staff, shared their experiences with each other and achieved good gains both educationally and culturally.

We attended the "Robotics and Programming with Sensors" workshop led by Hungarian IT teachers. In this context, we also got to know Raspberry Pi systems. Turkish-Hungarian teachers worked together on the creation and operation of "Eco-Farms". We also attended a workshop on microcontrollers, real-time communication and PLC controllers led by the Hungarian IT teacher.

Finally, a brainstorming session was held on how the latest technologies can help sustainability. At the end of the visit, we evaluated the meeting and received our certificates.

The activities and work carried out ensured good harmony and communication between the project partners. We enjoyed the work we were involved in. It created a good bond between the two partners and also strengthened and encouraged participation in the project. The visit provided up-to-date examples of work to share with other teachers and allowed the participants to see how new technologies are used today.

During the work, we discovered Hungarian culture and lifestyle. Mutual sympathy developed between both Hungarian and Turkish participants, which greatly contributed to the successful implementation of the project. The participants were positive in all areas of cooperation, whether professional or other qualifications, and were enriched by their experiences. The

project had a great impact on the participants because they said they would be very happy to participate in more Erasmus programmes in the future.
